ABOUT US

The Shomrim Society, a cornerstone in the history of the New York City Police Department, was founded in 1924, with the first president being the respected Capt. Jacob Kaminsky. It emerged from a spark of determination ignited by an offensive remark aimed at a young Jewish officer. Despite only 1% of the department being Jewish then, this fraternity and charitable organization began its journey.

The Shomrim Society hit its stride during the era of the Great Depression. Civil service jobs were essentially the lifeline of the people during those challenging times. From 1935 to 1937, the Shomrim Society grew by adding 400 members.

The year 1939 was a monumental time. Out of 33,000 individuals who took the test, only 1,440 had the honor of passing. Remarkably, Jewish individuals, making up one-third of those who succeeded, were the majority. These were people from all walks of life - college graduates, teachers, lawyers, accountants, and even doctors.

The NYPD Academy class 1940 produced some of the department's brightest stars. By the 1960s, members held esteemed positions such as Chief Inspector, Deputy Chief Inspector, the Chief of Detectives, the Chief of the Organized Crime Control Bureau, and the Chief of the Narcotics Division. Their success was so profound that it was dubbed the class that “the stars” (Insignia for Chiefs) fell on.

The NYPD Shomrim Society's legacy expands beyond New York, inspiring the establishment of a national organization. Today, Shomrim chapters are sprawling across over 10 states.

In the modern-day NYC Police Department, Jewish police officers occupy many positions and ranks, a testament to the lasting impact of the Shomrim Society. Our Spiritual Director, Rabbi Dr. Alvin Kass, the Chief Chaplain with a devout commitment since 1966, continues to guide us with his wisdom. The Shomrim Society stands as a beacon of resilience, unity, and community outreach in the proud history of the NYPD.
